

Leadership Teams Emerging

A revised organization chart has been emerging over the last two months at Prince of Peace. In an attempt to expand lay leadership involvement Vacancy Pastor Gary Rueter and the core staff have determined to focus on five ministry areas that most congregations use to accomplish their mission.

These areas are **Admin** (short for Administration), **Worship**, **Care & Outreach**, **Education**, and, in Prince of Peace's case, the **Preschool**. The plan is for each



of these areas to be headed by a Leadership Team consisting of five or more lay leaders, assisted by one of the full-time staff. Each Leadership Team will then select one of their lay members to be the chair and that person will be identified as the Lay Leader in that ministry area.

The Worship Ministry area has been operating in this way for a couple of months, with the Leadership Team of Robin Cary, David Leege, Jane Leeling, Craig Mosford, and Sara Wilson. Craig was selected to be the chair and has been serving as the Lay Leader for Worship Ministry. Pastor Gary has been serving as the staff person working with the team and Michael Rossi now also participates as an ex officio member.

The Preschool Ministry has also been functioning in this way with the School Board serving as the Leadership Team and **Gary Leeling**, as chair of the School Board as Lay Leader with **Cindy Deatherage**, the Director, staffing the team.

The other three areas of ministry are currently organizing Leadership Teams with **Stacey Crosson** staffing Care and Outreach Ministry, **John Durkin** staffing Education Ministry, and **Brad Womble** staffing Admin Ministry.

All five ministry areas are responsible to the Senior Pastor and report to him, and he reports to the Board of Servant Leaders (BOSL) who function on behalf of the Voters Assembly and God as the supervising group who seeks to accomplish the mission and ministry of Prince of Peace through policies established to describe the outcomes desired by the congregation, the limitations the Senior Pastor must not exceed, the relationship between BOSL and the Senior Pastor, and the operations of the BOSL. These policies and relationships are not effected by the revised chart.

Another part of the revised organization will be semi-annual gatherings offsite of the Lay Leaders and staff for each ministry area in order to do evaluation of the activities of the previous months, and planning and coordination of the activities for the months ahead.

The chart itself including lists of tasks assigned to each ministry area will be rolled out at the Town Hall Meetings scheduled for November 18/19 (see page 5).

Town Hall Meetings November 18 and 19

Fellowship Hall on Saturday, November 18 after the worship service (beginning at 6:45 p.m.) and again between the services on Sunday, November 19 (beginning at 9:30 a.m.). The purpose of the meetings will be to inform the congregation about the following:

- Examine **Bylaws changes** recommended by the committee appointed to study the number of members needed to petition for a special Voters Assembly, especially one involving the service of a called worker
- The rollout of an **Organization Chart** being developed to incorporate increased lay involvement in leadership
- Financial report for the 1st quarter of FY2017-18
- Capital Fund Campaign progress and the Narthex Renovation

Written feedback about the ministries of Prince of Peace will be solicited from those who attend the meeting.

Disaster Response Update:



Merry Christmas! Yes, it's still October, but our **Hypothermia Shelter Program** is getting started right now! **Our guests will be staying with us Christmas Eve through the morning of New Year's Eve, December 24-December 31** and there is immense preparation to host this heart changing event. POP has partnered with FACETS to serve our homeless neighbors for more than eight years. Each year we open our church home for one week, to those who need a warm, safe place to sleep. The shelter opens at 5:00 pm each evening. Guests receive a hot meal prepared by our Meal Teams and enjoy fellowship with our members. We also provide breakfast the next morning and a sack lunch to go. The shelter closes at 7:30 am each morning. **We typically serve over 250 guests throughout the week.**
